

POLICY STATEMENT #2 **Graduate Studies Program Scholarships**

POLICY

A practicing CRNM / CLPNM / CRPNM member who has been accepted for study or is currently enrolled in a Masters or Doctoral degree program may apply for this award.

University of Manitoba Students are not eligible for graduate scholarship awards administered by ARNM and must apply directly to the Graduate Awards Office at U of M.

All graduate students, including U of M students are eligible for named scholarships (Kay De Jong – Northern Nursing, Dennis Norbury – Obstetrics or Palliative Care or MGNA) *in addition to* this scholarship if the selection criteria are met.

APPLICATION OF POLICY

Applications with supporting documentation will be received between February 1st and March 31st of each year. ARNM will notify applicants of the award(s) decision within three months of the deadline dates. The number of recipients and the monetary award shall be determined by the ARNM Scholarship Committee and approved by the ARNM Board: decisions are final; there is no appeal process.

SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Practicing registration with the CRNM / CLPNM / CRPNM
2. Current member of ARNM
3. Accepted to a Masters or Doctoral studies program
4. Submitted an application as outlined below

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

1. Cover letter which outlines your professional goals; the relevance of the educational program to your professional nursing career, how you meet the criteria of named scholarships (if applicable), and how funding from ARNM will benefit you in your studies. This letter should be no longer than 400 words.
2. Completed general application form
3. Copy of Institution Letter of Acceptance/admission
